

St. Charles Community College (SCC) is pleased to announce it is once again offering ID-10 classes to the medical community. We have found a new source for grant funding as well as a tuition option for those who don't qualify or wish to participate in the grant program.

Our ICD-10 courses have been designed for **current ICD-9-CM coders** or individuals who have had ICD-9-CM coding instruction. *Knowledge of health record content review, coding process, anatomy and physiology, pathophysiology, medical terminology and pharmacology is required. These areas will not be covered in our ICD-10 courses.*

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What does it cost?

These ICD-10 courses are being offered to you through the **MoHealthWINS** program, which is funded by a grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Labor's Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training Grant Program. If you qualify for this grant, there will be no cost to you for the course tuition, however, some fees may apply. Classes must be completed by September 1, 2014. **If you do not qualify for the grant, or do not wish to participate, you may still enroll at full tuition.**

- **Online ICD-10-CM** (diagnosis only), \$145.00 online tuition + cost of training manual
- **Online ICD-10-CM/PCS** (diagnosis and procedures), \$245 online tuition + cost of training manuals
- **Classroom ICD-10-CM** (diagnosis only), \$200.00 tuition
- **Classroom ICD-10-CM/PCS** (diagnosis and procedures), \$400 tuition

How to Enroll?

To enroll in a class and **pay tuition**, simply register online at http://stcharles.augusoft.net/index.cfm?method=ClassListing.ClassListingDisplay&int_category_id=2&int_sub_category_id=101.

To be eligible under the **MoHealthWINS grant program**, you must:

- Be at least 17 years of age
- Be a United States citizen (or authorized to work in the US, documentation required)
- Meet any **one** of the following:
 - Be unemployed or underemployed
 - Need ICD-10 training to maintain/retain your current level of employment
 - Need ICD-10 training to advance your current career

- Complete a course enrollment application
- Register with the Missouri Career Center at <https://jobs.mo.gov/> (copy personal profile page)
- Earn a National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) (copy Certificate or individual score sheets) <http://www.act.org/certificate/earn.html>

prior to enrolling. ***This last requirement can be accomplished on campus at no charge to the student.*** Students who cannot come to campus to earn the NCRC, can do so independently at any conveniently located testing center <http://www.act.org/workkeys/locations.html>; however, students will be responsible for all testing costs incurred, if applicable.

By accepting to take part in the grant program, you understand that information on your application will be shared with the U.S. Department of Labor, approved MoHealthWINS partners and its funding entities for the purpose of compiling and reporting information as required.

To enroll in a class under the grant program only, all registration documents (application, MO Career Center registration proof, and NCRC) must be received by the SCC Workforce Development Office at least one week prior to the start date of the class.
