Synopsis of Findings:

This course contains a tremendous number of resources that could help students brush up on topics in reading, writing and mathematics. It is clear that many hours were spent vetting these resources. However, the course would be much improved if there were specific tracks of learning or review for students to follow and specific, measurable learning objectives for each identified type of student need (i.e. general skills improvement, placement preparation, etc...).

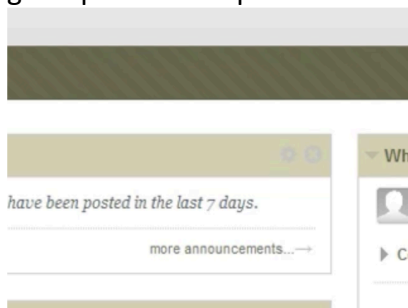
Other Comments:

Comments related to specific review standard 1.1: The goals and purpose of the site are clearly stated. I gave this an unsatisfactory rating. My feedback on this standard:

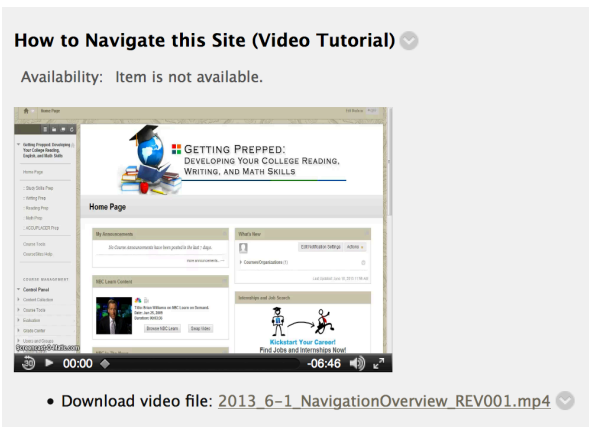
As a student, I would be overwhelmed with all the many resources. I would need a path to follow to reach certain goals...just review...placement test prep...etc... with pre- and post-tests and clearly stated objectives. I would have no way to determine which sections to focus on and whether or not they would help me. As a learner I would not be comfortable self-diagnosing my needs in the available resource areas. The advice given in the initial video was to just “click around and see what is helpful”. As a student, I would have no way to determine what would be helpful and what would not be helpful. I recommend narrowing the focus of this site into specific tracks for students that want to “review for placement” or “investigate careers” or other areas you have identified as being a need.

I have the following specific comments on other aspects of the Getting Started page:

- Welcome to Getting Prepped video – there is a typo in the transcript. Sentence “So if you are a strong reader but struggles with the concepts associated with...” should be “So if you are a strong reader but **struggle** with the concepts associated with...”
- Is the “Welcome to Getting Prepped” media file supposed to be a video or just audio? It just came up as audio for me with a static screen (see image below). Would recommend having an image or picture of a person there even if just audio. Image:



- Would also recommend some text in the video (or audio) link area that briefly introduces why the video should be watched. Something like: “watch this video (or listen to this audio segment) to receive a brief overview of the purpose and structure of the Getting Prepped site”
- On the “How to Navigate this Site” video, I see the image below. Not sure what “Availability: Item not Available” means as I was able to access the video through the



mp4 download. Image:

- The “How to Navigate this site” video did a good job of explaining the different parts of the website and the course.
- For the syllabus, I would recommend writing a “path” document that helps students follow a particular path through the materials depending upon their needs. Students need sample paths with recommendations on how to move through the materials.
- How do the NBC and job search links that are on the home page relate to the course objectives? Also, the info there did not show up on my screen...just blank pages. See image below.



Comments related to specific review standard 2.1 The instructional materials contribute to the achievement of the goals of the site. I gave this an unsatisfactory rating. My feedback on this standard:

My background, study, and experience in Instructional Design as well as long-time experience as a QM reviewer lead me to look closely at course and modules objectives. I found three stated objectives for this course as follows:

- Strengthen your reading, writing, and math skills,
- Provide you with opportunities to practice your skills,
- Provide you with a solid foundation – so that you can more successfully adapt to college-level work.

What I am struggling with is that these objectives are focused on what the site will provide not the specifics of what the student will get out of the site/class. I found a great acronym for writing measurable objectives from Elizabeth City State University:

So, rating review standard 2.1 is challenging because I feel the objectives are not written in a specific, measurable way. If you want to know if the site has lots of resources for students wanting to learn about reading, study skills, and math then absolutely...the site hits that mark. If you want to know if those resources help a student reach the identified course objectives, then I feel there are issues with that as I have indicated above.

Comments related to specific review standard 2.3 The instructional materials are appropriately designed for the level of the user. I gave this an unsatisfactory rating. My feedback on this standard:

My understanding is that this course was prepared for students first coming to college to help them prepare for placement and start their math, reading, and writing work at a higher level. If this is a correct understanding, then I believe that some of the materials are at too high a level for this group. Specifically in math, entry level, developmental students would not need to access content related to trigonometry nor would they need to practice or work on problems that are challenging to middle school students (Figure This – NCTM site). Also, in the writing area I found resources that were created for teachers and were to be used in the classroom (Practice In-Class Writing Exercises – UNC link).

Comments related to specific review standard 2.4 Materials are organized in chunks so that users can access resources and materials relevant to their needs. I gave this an unsatisfactory rating. My feedback on this standard:

Materials were organized according to Parts in each area but there was no consistent vertical structure for this organization and there was no clear path through the parts. I could not see that the parts directly helped students to obtain the stated learning objectives although I could see some thread of practice and prep in some of the areas.

I have other comments related to certain specific sections of the areas as follows:

- Math Review – links to Virtual Nerd did not open in the content window...required external window...not clear how to get back to Bb content except to use back button on browser. See image below:

- Reading Review – The files are powerpoints or word documents...question the “ease of use” of this medium. Requires students to open and download a file and page through it (PPT) or to have Word (.docx). Also wonder about using OER in the file names unless students are familiar with it.
- Main Idea practice (under Part 1 Reading Comprehension) has the answers provided immediately ...and contains a slide at the end that references class work...this might not make sense to a student not in an official class
- Part Two – Vocabulary Development – Vocabulary – Roots, Prefixes, Suffixes skills practice Games – see image below – first three links required plugins that would not allow the application to load:
