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Pathways to Manufacturing

In just five weeks, individuals are trained and prepare for entry-level careers in Advanced Manufacturing.

The Pathways to Manufacturing program not only focuses on technical skills but also includes employability skills and job readiness prep. Training is delivered in an active learning environment. Students are expected to fully participate in lab activities, site visits as well as online learning and assessment.

This training offers the opportunity to earn all of the following certifications:

- Manufacturing Skills Standards Certification (MSSC) – Certified Production Technician (You will receive two of the four certifications.)
- OSHA 30 hour safety certification
- First Aid/CPR certification
- National Career Readiness Certificate
- GRCC Advanced Manufacturing Certification

Get the hands on experience you need to land a job with great pay, great benefits and a career track that can take you to the top. If you want a job where you get the satisfaction of creating, building or fixing something; a career in manufacturing is for you. Consider this: most of today's top executives in the manufacturing industry started out where you are – **Exploring skilled trades career pathways.**

Grand Rapids Community College has many different pathways to start a lucrative career in manufacturing.

The Advanced Manufacturing Partnership (AMP) program is a collaboration between West Michigan manufacturers, students and GRCC to address the talent shortage the region is experiencing. Companies provide a full-ride scholarship for students to obtain an associate degree while working for the sponsoring company. Students start in entry level jobs (\$12-14 per hour) and have the opportunity to advance based on their schoolwork and performance on the job.

Welding Fabrication Job Training Program

This 18-week, 32-hour-a-week training program gives you level 1 American Welding Society Certifications. You also have the opportunity to earn an OSHA 10 card and First Aid/CPR certification. It prepares you for jobs such as: welders, cutters and brazers. Wages for these positions range from \$12.03-17.03 per hour.

Welding Technology Certificate Program

One-year certification program in welding provides students with a quick way of learning the fundamental skills of welding. Students learn oxyacetylene (gas) welding, arc welding and inert gas-shielded techniques. It prepares you for jobs such as: welders, cutters, welder fitters, structural metal fabricators and fitters. Wages for these positions range from \$12.75-18.58 per hour.

Welding Technology Associates Degree

Get top of the line American Welding Society (AWS) credentials in a two-year welding associate degree program. Graduates of this program have gone to work in the aerospace, boiler and piping, construction and repair welding industries. They are also eligible for testing as associate welding inspectors in the AWS code.

OCNC/Precision Machining

This 18-week, 32-hour-a-week training program gives you the opportunity to earn up to three NIMS (National Institute for Metalworking) certifications, plus an OSHA 10-hour card and First Aid/CPR Certification. It prepares you for jobs such as: CNC operators, machinists and programmer. Wages for these positions range from \$15.16-17.35 per hour.





Tooling and Manufacturing Technology Certificate

This one-year certificate program prepares graduates to become certified skilled tradespeople. These positions often pave the way for careers in manufacturing, tool and die, mold making and precision machining.

Tooling and Manufacturing Technology Associates Degree

The tooling and manufacturing program trains technicians for employment in the modern tooling and manufacturing industry. Program graduates are prepared be become manufacturing engineering technicians, skilled tradespersons (tool and die or mold makers) or CNC programmers. Wages for these positions range from \$16-23.50 per hour.

Manufacturing Readiness Program

This 40-hour program prepares you for entry-level careers in the manufacturing sector. Why take it? You get an opportunity to visit manufacturing sites to see what today's manufacturing looks like. Learn basic skills used by manufacturers such as lean manufacturing, quality and basic metallurgy and assembly. Students are guaranteed at least two interviews with manufacturers and receive help creating resumes and preparing for interviews. Wages for these entry-level positions (include team assemblers and production workers) range from \$11-\$13.59 per hour.

Industrial Sewing Program

This 192-hour program prepares individuals for an industry that is returning to the U.S. In this program individuals will be introduced to sewing processes for production, safety and ergonomics for sewing, industrial sewing machines and equipment operation. Sewing jobs in west Michigan are available in the furniture industry, boating industry and shoe industry. Individuals leaving this program are prepared for entry-level sewing positions that range from \$10-19 per hour.

© Certified Production Technician (CPT)

The CPT program is 168 hours of classroom and active lab-learning to work in the manufacturing sector. Students have the opportunity to earn the following national credentials: OSHA 30 safety card, Manufacturing Skills Standards Certified (MSSC) CPT-Quality, MSSC CPT-Production, Forklift, and First Aid/CPR certification. Students are guaranteed at least two interviews with manufacturers and are prepared for positions as quality technicians and production technicians. Wages for these positions range from \$14-18 per hour.

Mechatronics Certificate/ Electrical Controls

This certificate program is designed to give a student the basic skills required of an industrial machine service personnel and prepares students to design, install, troubleshoot and repair machine electrical systems with an emphasis in manufacturing equipment. In many fields this position is called multi-skilled technician. This certificate program prepares students for jobs such as Industrial machinery technician. Wages for these positions range from \$15.60-19.86 per hour.
