Solution JOB GROWTH

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics predicts that the job outlook for those in the culinary arts, particularly cooks, chefs, and food preparation workers, will grow at the average rate (about 8.72 percent) through 2018. This growth is projected because of the anticipated expansion of food service outlets, and the turnover expected to occur over that period of time.

Transfer Option Associate in Science — Hospitality Administration, Transfer Option

The Transfer Option Associate's degree provides students with a strong course foundation in hospitality management, business, sciences and liberal arts. These courses prepare students for transfer to a baccalaureate institution. The program provides a wide educational background in many disciplines that are required to fulfill management positions in the challenging field of hospitality administration.

Associate's Degree

Associate in Science — Hospitality Administration

WHAT can you do with an A.S. Degree in the Hospitality Administration field? According to HCareers (www.hcareers.com/us/resourcecenter) you can find careers in:

• Food & Beverage — Kitchen managers, restaurant managers, lead chefs, bar managers, catering supervisors, and food and beverage directors for resort and hotel properties. Wages for food and beverage managers can expect to make between \$41,052 and \$83,699 per year.

 Lodging (hotels and resorts) — Guest services, housekeeping, general hotel, human resource, and sales management. Wages are approximately **\$26,000 to \$149,465** per year.

• **Spas** — Operations management, general spa management, as well as lead spa professional and technician jobs with supervision over other employees in the spa. Annual wages for spa managers are approximately \$35,250 and up depending on the establishment.

• **Travel** — Cruise directors, managing travel agents, youth and children activities directors, tour managers, and recreation managers. Travel industry managers can expect to make between \$57,770 and \$110,852 per year.

• **Events** — Event planning can involve weddings, fundraisers, company conventions, concerts, and theater production. Wages for events management personnel can be between \$51,613 and \$100,845 per year.
