Located at the Bunker Hill Community College Chelsea Campus, the 15-month Paramedic Studies Certificate program provides instruction in advanced emergency medical skills including patient assessment, pharmacology, EKG interpretation, ACLS, PALS, and ITLS.

The program, which follows the National Standard EMT-Paramedic Curriculum, meets and/or exceeds the requirements set forth by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Office of Emergency Medical Services. BHCC's experienced instructors utilize state-of-the-art equipment, including a self-contained ambulance simulator. BHCC is committed to preparing graduates with the knowledge, skill and professional attributes associated with entry-level Paramedic positions.

Successful completion of the certificate program provides students with the opportunity to become National Registered Paramedics.

BHCC also offers students the opportunity to earn an Associate Degree in Paramedic Studies upon completion of additional courses.

Requirements for Admission

- 1) Current BLS-Health Care Provider CPR Certification
- 2) Current EMT-Basic/Advanced Certification (with a minimum of one year's experience)
- 3) CORI/SORI Report
- 4) BIO 108: Human Biology/ Lab
- 5) ENG 111: College Writing I
- 6) High school diploma or G.E.D. certificate
- 7) Attendance at a mandatory information session
