Health Professional's Responsibilities

1. Educate the public about the normal aging process
2. Be alert to signs of abuse and neglect
 1. Elderly usually do not report the abuse
3. Mandated by law to report ASAP
 1. Verbal report by phone asap to adult abuse registry hotline: 1-800-451-5155
 2. Long-term care ombudsman at 714-479-0107 or 1-800-4024(CRISIS LINE)
FAILURE TO REPORT IS A MISDEMEANOR AND RESULTS IN PUNISHMENT
4. Assist overburdened caregivers in finding resources to relieve a stressful situation
 4. Caregivers need training and respite
