Learning Resources and Program Support Materials Guide

Grant funded curricula must meet certain criteria to be loaded into US DOL/ETAs repository SkillsCommons. The following will identify the deliverables to be loaded and the requirements for those deliverables.

"All online and technology-enabled content and courses developed under this SGA must incorporate the principles of universal design in order to ensure that they are readily accessible to qualified individuals with disabilities. The content and courses must be in full compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and Sections 504 and 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.0, Level AA."

All materials created or enhanced by grant funds must be loaded into SkillsCommons, including **Learning Resources** and **Program Support Materials**. All materials must be free of copyright.

If copyrighted materials were used as part of a course, the source of the materials must be identified. (For example – If an instructor teaches a course with "canned" content from a publisher, the syllabus for the course must be submitted with credit (cited/referenced) being given to the publisher OR If an instructor uses a lab/test/photo/example from a textbook (or other source), the lab/test /photo/example is not submitted but a statement such as "A lab on <u>topic</u> was utilized to instruct students on <u>description/subject</u>. The lab was obtained from (<u>cite source</u>)").

Assessments and other evaluation materials may be given EMBARGO status (those accessing would need to request permission to view the content via a pre-determined contact person/dept. on each campus).

ALL content/materials must meet certain criteria prior to loading into SkillsCommons (Checklist below). All content must be:

- Universally Designed for Learning (UDL) meets the needs of various learners, clear goals/objectives, provides opportunities and purposefully reduces barriers to learning. All online and technology-enabled content *and* courses developed under this grant must incorporate the principles of universal design for learning see <u>CAST website</u> in order to ensure that they are readily accessible to qualified individuals with disabilities.
- Accessible according to ADA 504 and 508 all Learning Resource and Support Materials must meet ADA standards for accessibility. The standards apply to text (text to speech), spacing, font, pictures/images, charts, diagrams, videos, flashing, color, etc. for all Learning Resource and Support Materials.
 - A quick initial check in Word Save your document first then re-open it. Click on File (top left of document). New screen will open. Click on Check for Issues (square option in middle). Click on Check Accessibility from the drop down options. Use the arrow in the top left of this screen to go back to your document to view the Inspection Results to the right of the document. Click on each issue for instructions on how to resolve that issue.

- **Copyright free or referenced** All Learning Resources and Support Materials must be free of copyrighted materials or be properly referenced. Reference should include source information and a brief description of how the materials were used.
