Course Description: This course is an introduction to the concepts and skills that serve as a foundation for the health care professional providing care to patients ages 65 and older. This course will also introduce students to the information about the aging process and related medical, psychological and cognitive changes that are needed to effectively care for the elderly person in a long-term care center or at home. Topics will include organ system changes during aging, therapeutic and caregiver communication, elder abuse, personal care for the elderly, commonly prescribed medications etc.

Student Learning Outcome: Student will demonstrate an understanding of basic principles and skills required to provide quality patient care to geriatric patients. Student will perform basic skills to assist in providing care with activities of daily living.

<u>Course Theory Objectives</u>: At the completion of the course students will be able to:

- 1. Identify organ system changes to various body systems during aging.
- 2. Define and describe therapeutic and effective communication with the elderly.
- 3. Identify and describe common types of assisted living communities.
- 4. Define and describe code of ethics and HIPPA regulations pertaining to confidentiality with the elderly.
- 5. Define and describe indicators of elder abuse in senior care centers.



6. Demonstrate an understanding of oral hygiene, personal care, and cognitive impairments for the elderly client etc.

<u>Course Clinical Objectives</u>: At the completion of the course students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate and practice techniques for promoting infection control with the elderly client.
- 2. Demonstrate and practice oral hygiene.
- 3. Provide assistance to elderly client with ADL's. (Activities of Daily Living)
- 4. Demonstrate and practice techniques for promoting safety while providing personal care for the elderly.
- 5. Demonstrate and practice vital sign assessment.
- 6. Demonstrate and practice therapeutic communication.
- 7. Demonstrate and practice reporting and recording of patient data.
