PROCEDURE: ASSESSING PERIPHERAL PULSES

SKILL: This checklist is used to evaluate student's ability to locate all the peripheral pulses.

Equipment/Supplies: One sheet of Avery Removable Round Color Coding labels. **Standards:** Given the needed equipment and a place to work, the student will perform this skill with __75___ % accuracy.

PROCEDURE STEPS:

To take your pulse rate:

- 1. Wash hands.
- 2. Greet and identify the patient and explain procedure.
- 3. Using a watch with a second hand and place it on your right wrist or on the table next to your left hand.
- 4. After finding your pulse, count the number of beats for 20 seconds.
- 5. Multiply by 3 to get your heart rate, or beats per minute (or just count for 60 seconds for a math-free option).
