Week 4: Evaluation

Evaluation goes hand in hand with analysis. In fact, you can't really evaluate something without analyzing it first, as you will see the three steps below. Think of evaluation in terms of judgment. We evaluate/judge things all the time. Every time to choose one breakfast cereal over another, we are evaluating. In fact, any time you choose to buy anything, you evaluated it to determine if it was worth your money. Many of us are also evaluated at work.

Evaluation has three parts:

- 1. Criteria (what are the standards I will use to judge this thing)
- 2. Judgment (based on those standards, is this thing good or bad? This is your analysis.)
- 3. Evidence (specifics to back up your judgment)

Always remember those three pieces of an evaluation, especially the first. Without criteria, you have no basis of judgment.
