Grant Summary

- The LAH3C Grant is designed to build a collaborative partnership model between workforce systems, employers, and community colleges.
- Partnership between the 9 LACCD colleges and regional employers will impact the development of healthcare education.
- This is a 3-year effort to improve the preparation of students in the educational pipelines for careers in the health care field.
- The grant supports the success of community college students in health care career pathways.

TIER 1: Foundational Competencies for College and Career Success

- Assessment will measure each student's current capabilities, interests, and education goals.
- Assessment will determine level of English, Math, and computer competencies needed for Tier 2.
- Assessment and remediation in English, Math, and Basic Computer Skills, if appropriate.



Tier 1

Provides a Health Care Pathway Orientation

- Student will be introduced to the variety of careers on this pathway.
- Student will take SPHERIT, a self-assessment questionnaire that leverage their strengths to overcome their challenges and identify non-academic aspects of life that can impact success.
- Student will meet with a counselor and create an educational plan.



TIER 2: Healthcare Core Curriculum

Industry recognized Health Science Foundation Credential based upon workplace competencies identified by regional employers in the health care industry.

TIER 3: Health Science Academic Pathway

Health Care Career Pathways

- Students enroll into existing and strengthened health care programs academic programs within the LACC District.
- Students earn certificates from existing and new industry-driven health care programs.



TIER 4: Associate Degree and Transfer

- Students complete academic requirements and achieve healthcare competencies that result in a degree and/or certificate.
- Students complete academic professional programs leading to employment in the health care industry.
- Students complete academic professional programs that result in successful transfer to institution of higher learning.
