The Industrial Maintenance Technology Program offers several training options designed for traditional college students, as well as industry professionals looking to increase their knowledge.

GCCC offers several seminar style trainings to industry professionals looking to further their education. These trainings are 4.5 days long and are structured to be an intense, fast paced training which will cover the material offered in a three-week traditional course.

Students looking to start a career in Industrial Maintenance Technology as an Electrician, Automation Technician, or Plant Maintenance Technician have three GCCC Certificate options. The GCCC Certificates in addition to Industry Recognized Credentials demonstrate that our students have the skills and knowledge required to succeed in the industry.

**IMT Certificate A - (16 credit hours)
completion in one semester**

- Safety, Mechanical Introduction, Predictive Maintenance, Shop Operations, Math Processes for Technicians, Basic Pneumatics

**IMT Certificate B - (31 credit hours)
completion in two semesters**

- Electrical 1 and 2, Motor Controls, Basic Hydraulics, and Basic PLC programming

**IMT Certificate C - (46 credit hours)
completion in three semesters**

- Advance PLC programming, Advanced Motor Controls, Frequency Drives, Electro Hydraulics and Electro Pneumatics

All Certificate courses have an optional CMRT certification. Students wishing to attain an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) can do so by completing an additional 14 credit hours of general education requirements.
