CIS 171-001 Java: Course Syllabus

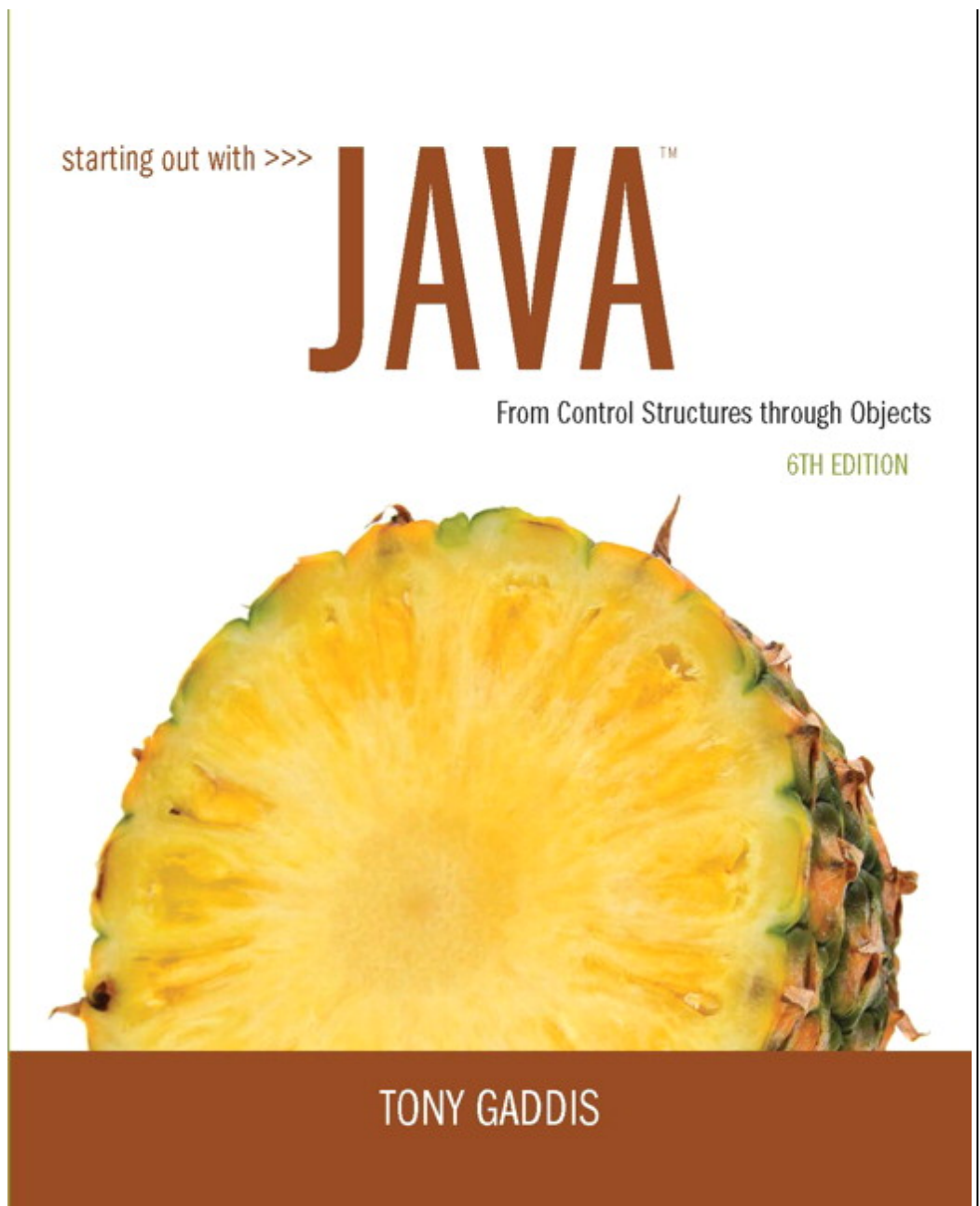
