Nursing

The Nursing program at Southeastern Community College is a ladder program. The Practical Nursing diploma program prepares students for Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) licensing. Students completing the Associate Degree Nursing program earn an AAS degree and are prepared to become a licensed Registered Nurse (RN) and may transfer to a four-year institution for a BSN if desired. Nurses care for patients in a variety of settings. RNs may advise patients on health maintenance and disease prevention.

Tasks

- Prepare patients for exams, tests or treatments and explain procedures
- Monitor, record and report patients' conditions

- Works as part of a healthcare team to assess patient needs, plan and implement nursing interventions
- Administer medication and perform procedures
