Course Information Specifics

Course Description:

Course prerequisite of HSC-120 Medical Terminology I strongly recommended; or work experience in a medical setting. This three credit hour course is a continuation of HSC-120 Medical Terminology I. A brief review of basic medical terminology followed by a systems approach to learning terms associated with the anatomical, physiological, and pathological aspects of the body

Learning Materials:

Davi-Ellen Chabner: The Language of Medicine, 11th Edition. Saunders, an imprint of Elsevier Inc. This is the same text that was used for NIACC's Medical Terminology I offerings. Note that you will not need a publisher access code as this course is a continuation of Medical Terminology I.

Measurable Course Objectives:

- Identify medical terms by analyzing their Greek and Latin components.
- Construct medical terms from Greek and Latin prefixes, suffixes, word roots and combining forms.
- Spell medical words correctly.

- Recognize correct pronunciation of medical terms.
- Recognize parts of speech used in medical terminology and practice correct utilization.
- Recall the anatomical relationship of medical terms to body structure.
- Identify medical terms of pathological conditions and abbreviations associated with the various body systems.
- Demonstrate knowledge with acceptable scoring on periodic examinations.

Course Units:

We will cover Chapter 1 as a review, followed by Chapters 13 - 22.

Overview of Major Assignments:

This course offering will require the submission of weekly assignments/exams. All introductory assignments and weekly exam scores will be entered on Canvas course gradebook upon submission.
