New Mexico Skill UP Network Pathway celeration in Technology & Healthcare (SUN PATH) is a U.S. Department of Labor funded grant enhancing healthcare education at community colleges to better meet local healthcare workforce needs. SUN PATH partners community colleges with local healthcare employers to get their inputs on employee skills and training they need to support their businesses/healthcare practices. The grant targets veterans, unemployed, underemployed and underprepared workers.

NA-112 Requirements:

- PPD (Tuberculosis) test: within the last year (cannot expire during clinical)
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella): series of two (2) doses or a titer showing immunity
- ◆ Varicella (Chicken Pox): series of two (2) doses or a titer showing immunity
- ♦ Hepatitis B: series of 3 doses or a titer showing immunity
- Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis): every 10 years (cannot expire during clinical)
- ♦ Influenza (Flu) vaccine: annual
- ◆ NM Dept of Health Caregiver Background Check & fingerprints (included in course fees)
- Maroon colored scrubs
- ♦ White shoes (no cloth)
- ♦ Name badge (provided)
 - *Immunizations & uniform expenses are not covered by course fees.
