Oral information given to class:

Blood Pressure 120/80 PR 72

Hx: LV 6 mo, filling LL, good previous experience, no complications w/past work. Brushing 2x/day, reports not flossing, uses waterpik reg. Reports good diet

CC: wants to establish, reports some tenderness LL

Goals: "I want to keep my teeth, and not get more fillings."

Clinical Exam: some percussive response #14. Generalized moderate gingivitis. Existing: MOD amalgam @ #14, Cracked, recurrent decay, Composite fillings @ #6, #7, #10, #26. Extensive caries at #2, #5, #12, #14, #15, incipient or moderate caries at #11, #20, #21, #23, #28, #29

Oral Cancer Screen: (-)

Tx: 4 quads root plane scale, PFC crowns #2, #5, #12, #14, #15. Re-eval #6, #7, #10, #26

Discussed w/pt, No Q

Next visit: Fillings and crowns upper right.
