- 1. Call To Order/New Committee Members: The meeting was called to order at 1:37p.m. The Chair introduced Megan Keebler, the new Curriculum Representative from Instructional Support. She also introduced our guests Helen Leung and Misty Burruel.
- 2. **Review and Approval of April 5, 2017 Expanded Summary Notes:** The summary notes were approved as presented 17/0/1.

3. Discussion Items:

3.1. How to Read the Vocational Page in the Program Checklist when Reviewing Programs and Certificates in Curriculum Committee Member Queue:

The Chair guided the committee on how to open and review the required CTE attachments for CTE programs:

- 1. Log into Curricunet
- 2. Click on "All Proposals"
- 3. Find the degree and click "Check Status"
- 4. On the Program Checklist, click on "Vocational-CTE Only"
- 5. Enrollment and Projections will be completed by the Chair and Faculty.
- 6. The Labor Market Analysis must be obtained from the Center of Excellence and downloaded on that checklist page.
- 7. The Advisory Committee Minutes should include a discussion on the path to employment and if the degree meets the skills wanted by employers. Names and job titles of members must be present and votes must be documented. The notes need to be attached in the advisory section on this checklist.

These documents will be reviewed by the Tech Committee and Curriculum Committee before the program is approved. The Chancellor's Office is releasing more authority for local approval of Curriculum and the committee will be responsible for looking closely at these degrees.

- **3.2.** New Course Submission Timeline: Fall registration has moved up to May 8 this academic year; as a result, the deadline for new course submissions may be earlier to allow for scheduling building. The Chair asked that all Faculty ensure that a new course is needed by students and does not serve solely as stand-alone. The Faculty Senate President reminded the committee to share this new registration date with students as it is new for everyone.
- **3.3. Report on current Curricunet Queue (Sharon Awad):** The Administrative Assistant II for Curriculum, Sharon Awad, reported that all new courses submitted by the November 7, 2016 deadline were both locally and state approved except for six courses. Those not approved were either still being worked on by the originator, the course(s) were tabled due to various reasons at the Curriculum Committee meeting, or were still pending Dean approval. She also reported that same reasoning applies to course and program modifications submitted before the March 3, 2017 deadline. All Distance Education proposals submitted before the October 1, 2016 deadline are completely approved. Majority of courses in the queue now are from the required course updates that were due March 22, 2017. The course update reminders will be sent every May and December and the queue may seem long until all courses are caught up with their appropriate updates.
- **3.4. Election Results:** The Curriculum Representatives named their representatives for the 2017-2018 academic year.
 - 1. **Instructional Support:** Megan Keebler, new member.
 - 2. **Kinesiology, Nutrition, and Athletics:** Annette Henry will return.
 - 3. **Language Arts:** Stephen Calebotta will return. Stephen Shelton will substitute for Stephen Calebotta while he is on Sabbatical in the fall.
 - 4. **Mathematics and Science:** Rob Kopp will return.
 - 5. **Pending:** Business and Applied Technology
 - 6. **Pending:** Visual and Performing Arts
 - 7. **Pending:** Social and Behavioral Sciences
 - 8. **Pending:** Health Sciences
 - 9. **Pending:** Student Services. Lucy Serrano will continue.
 - 10. **Pending:** Chino Representative (Michael Escobosa is one Chino Representative).
- 3.5. GE-AP CREDIT POLICY (PPT-Handout): The Chair shared that the AP Policy is on the Curriculum Committee's goals for this year. The handout explains that the state is currently working on the AP-GE Policy. The community colleges anticipate official guidance from the State in the summer. The Articulation Officer shared that the law says AP scores apply to GE credit and it is up to discipline faculty to decide if an AP test will count for a major course. The State hopes to standardize this policy across the community colleges. The Catalog and Schedule Coordinator and Dr. Randall will work with the Deans and Faculty on creating the most up-to-date list of AP Exams and Discipline Course Credit that displays AP Exam-to-Course Equivalency. This new information will be reflected in the catalog. There is also information on Statway and Quantitative Reasoning. The Statway course that we have in the queue is a pilot course with the Carnegie Foundation. This course will be at Fontana High School upon approval.
- **3.6. End of Year Party:** The Office of Instruction and Institutional Effectiveness will sponsor the end of the year party. The Curriculum Office will send an email to the committee with more details of the party.
- 4. Interdisciplinary Studies-Name Change and Description Edits: On January 18, 2017, the committee approved the name change and removal of transfer language from each of the current University Studies degrees. The committee also approved the Chair making these changes should no Faculty volunteer to make the edits. Misty Burruel, speaking on behalf of the University Studies Workgroup, which was created at the request of Faculty Senate (separate from the Curriculum Committee's subcommittee studying University Studies), reported that some members of this group feel that this degree may not serve students as there is not a clear goal or outcome that is tied to assessment. At the request of the Chair, Misty will provide a progress report of the workgroup's discussions to the Curriculum Committee. The Catalog and Schedule Coordinator shared that based upon PSR Program Award Data, there is a 10% decrease in the of awarding of the University Studies: Arts and Humanities Degree and 3% decrease in the awarding of the University Studies: Social and Behavioral Science degree. The committee also discussed that many students are getting multiple degrees which led

to the discussion of unit differentiation-a discussion which will be held at a later time. The numbers on the OLAP cubes show that thousands of degrees are being awarded. The second point of discussion pertained to whether or not the area of emphases are misleading in that they suggest a specialization will be given in those areas. This led to a discussion on the creation of one General Studies degree. The main question surrounding this approach is, what courses will be placed in this degree, as there is no concrete guidance from the Chancellor's Office. The logistics of this will need to be discussed among many constituents including Counseling and Discipline Faculty. The Curriculum Committee goal next year is to create one general degree that will tie in with the college's movement toward Guided Pathways. Discussion of Interdisciplinary Studies will continue next year.
