

## **COURSE OUTLINE**

Title: Scaffold Training for the Competent Person

## **Project/Course Description:**

This class is designed for individuals with at least some scaffold experience and is mostly classroom based with some basic hands-on scaffold erection and inspection. It will include a thorough look at the OSHA 29 CFR Part 1926 Subpart L scaffold standard necessary for hazard identification as well as recommended assembly and inspection procedures.

A book is required for this course.

Participants will receive a competent person trained card from the Scaffold Training Institute.

Finally, the definition of a competent person requires the individual to have the authority to take prompt corrective action. No course can provide that authority, since it can only be provided by the employer.

- Perform a scaffold inspection:
  - o Major items to consider
  - Checklist to follow
  - Hands-on inspections at different stages of completion
- Specify the major elements of OSHA's regulation 29 CFR Subpart L -Scaffolding
