Title: MSHA Part 46 – New Miner Training

Project/Course Description:

This 3-day course is designed anyone engaged in shell dredging or employed at sand, gravel, surface stone, surface clay, colloidal phosphate, or surface limestone mines, or persons, partnerships, corporations, subsidiaries of a corporation, firms, associations, or other organizations that contract to perform services at any of the above listed sites.

Course fully meets all Federal requirements. No additional training at a mine site is required.

Upon completion of the course, students will receive an MSHA Form 5000-23 certifying that they have completed required Part 46 training.

- Complete the mandatory training topics, which meet MSHA guidelines.
- Identify hazards typically found at mines
- Utilize appropriate controls to minimize exposure to hazards
