Process and Protocols

Earned Media: How Hawthorne Can Help

Many partner colleges have internal marketing and press departments that do a great job of supporting programs. However, Hawthorne Strategy Group is available to help with press outreach in a few ways, for times when internal marketing departments don't have capacity or are open to outside help. Below are a couple ways that Hawthorne can support:

- Reaching out to press about events: If you are planning an event to get the word out about your program, Hawthorne can help reach out to press to 1) ask them to promote the event 2) invite press to the event if appropriate.
- Developing press releases: Hawthorne can help you identify news to develop press
 releases about, and can take the lead in developing with your input. Any and all
 materials will not go out without review from internal marketing departments. The
 Hawthorne team is also happy to develop press releases that are ultimately distributed
 by your internal marketing/press department.
- Identifying appropriate press contacts: You know your industries/communities better than anyone. But, Hawthorne is available to look up contact information or help you identify trade/employer magazine contacts to reach out to in order to educate them about your programs.

 - Advances in science and research have led to new industries and jobs in biotechnology throughout Illinois. Economic activity in this growing area is called the "bioeconomy."
 - Consortium partners Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Lewis and Clark College, Lincoln Land Community College, Carl Sandburg College, and Southeastern Illinois College – are working together to match career-oriented educational and training programs with new jobs in Illinois' expanding bioeconomy.
 - o Programs prepare students for careers and well-paying jobs, such as:
 - Biochemical Engineer
 - Biofuels Production Manager
 - Biofuels/Biodeisel Technology and Product Development Manager
 - Petroleum Pump System Operator, Refinery Operator and Gauger
 - Water and Wastewater Treatment Plant and System Operator
 - Water Resource Specialist
- With flexible training and degree programs, the Building Illinois' Bioeconomy Consortium is preparing traditional college students and those seeking new job opportunities for middle-skills careers and wages in this growing industry.
 - o Programs are available online and on campus, with hands-on options outside of the typical classroom atmosphere.
 - o Fast-track programs are available, with certificate programs that are eight weeks and shorter.

- o Tuition and cost options are variable, with potential for as low as \$115/credit hour. Financial help is often available for those who qualify.
