- Veterans Services

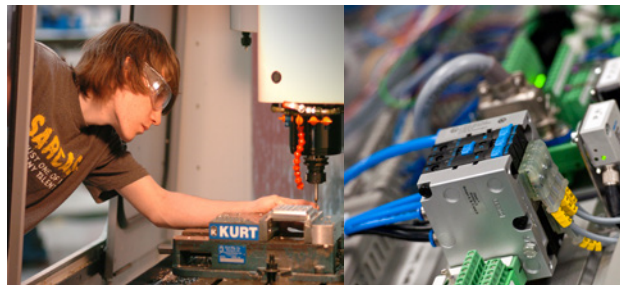

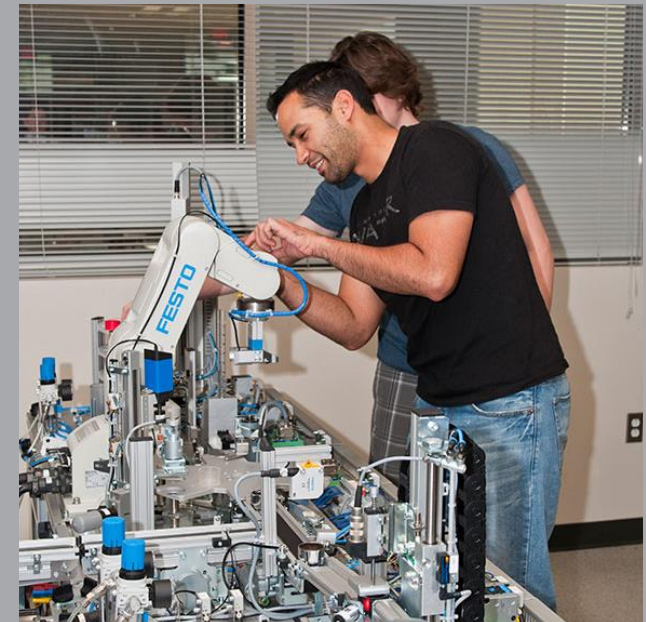

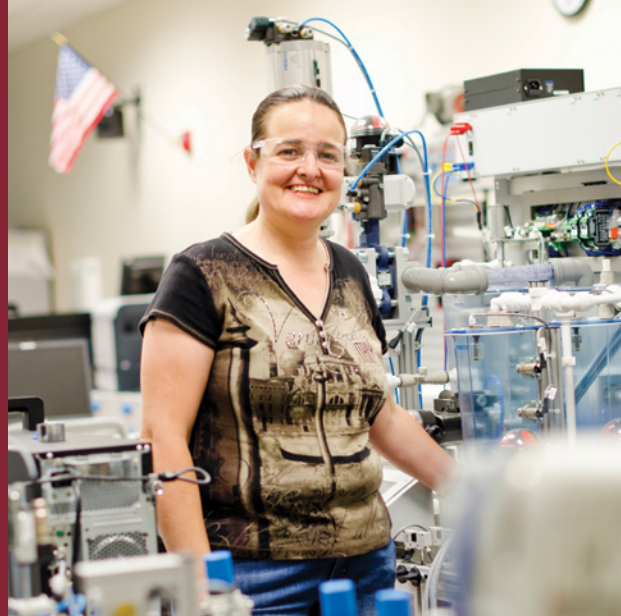
