



Essential Employability Skills (EES) go by many names, such as soft skills, interpersonal skills, essential skills, social skills, 21st century skills, and applied skills. **They are the collection of skills necessary to succeed in the workplace beyond those typically learned in academic settings. They are sometimes referred to as behaviors and traits but can be learned and refined through experience, modeling, and practice.** They include, but are not limited to, adaptability, critical thinking, communication, empathy, open-mindedness, problem-solving, teamwork, and work ethic. The number of EES and the individual importance of each cannot be disconnected from industry and occupation. (*Workforce Readiness Committee of the Workforce Talent Development Board*)
