# **Employability Skills Badging Framework**



#### Consortium Goal

- Develop an Employability Skills Badging Framework to be implemented by the Oregon SCC Grant Consortium Colleges in partnership with:
  - industry employers
  - Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC)
  - Oregon Workforce Talent and Development Board (WTDB)
  - regional workforce boards
  - K-12 partners

## The Employability Skills Badging Framework will:

- Align with and build upon the Oregon Employability Skills badging framework in K-12
- Consider varying levels along a secondary to post-secondary continuum
- ➤ Include levels, skills categories and assessments
- > Establish credit for prior learning options for students

#### Consortium Community Colleges and Industry Partners working together to:

- Identify the programs within Advanced Manufacturing and Cybersecurity in which to implement the badging framework
  - o credit programs
  - o non-credit programs
  - apprenticeship
  - o pre-apprenticeship
  - o IET
- Map the employability skill badges to program curricula in either Advanced Manufacturing or Cybersecurity or both
- Create a visual crosswalk for badge acceptance by Oregon high schools, as Credit for Prior Learning (CPL), and from consortium colleges; with consideration for:
  - badging system platform differences
  - o badging implementation program differences (e.g., IET, credit, apprenticeship)
  - LMS integration differences & impact this may have on issuing badges
- Pilot the Employability Skills Badging Framework by all consortium colleges by Fall 2023
- Fully-implement the Employability Skills Badging Framework by Winter 2024

## <u>Dedicated "Badging Work Group" meeting regularly</u>

Membership includes all 9 consortium colleges, industry, HECC and K-12

- > Developing employability skills badging imagery that incorporates consortium and individual CCs
- > Establishing a "home" for issuing badges (e.g., individual college, consortium level)
