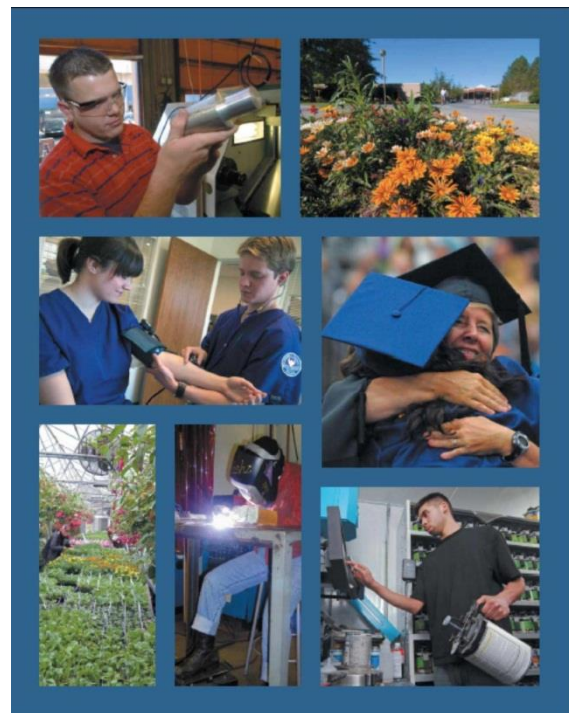
All of the 17 community colleges have adopted the three “C” strategies: Career Pathways, Credit for Prior Learning, and Career Coaching.

- Innovative customized training programs to meet student needs and employer expectations.
- Personalized coaching for students as they persist and progress through training programs.
- Job search assistance in high-demand occupations.
- Increased industry engagement in training programs and with campus activities.
