About SFCC's Nurse Aide Skills Certificate

State Fair Community College's Nurse Aide Skills Certificate is designed to provide you with the training you need to become a Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA), Certified Medication Technician (CMT), Restorative Nurse Assistant (RNA), or a Home Health

The courses in this program are offered on-ground and online, and clinicals will be on-site. SFCC is the only college in its 14-county service area that offers the combination of courses included in this Skills Certificate.

Need for health care specialists

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration on Aging, predicts that by 2030 there will be 72.1 million older persons, more than twice the number in 2000 and nearly 20 percent of the population. The area of mid-Missouri served by SFCC has one of the fastest growing populations of older persons as a percentage of the population in the country. This highlights

the importance of the health care community, including long-term health care facilities, which will be important employers of graduates of these SFCC programs.

Program costs

Tuition and fees for 2013-2014 for in-district residents (Pettis and Benton counties and the city of Otterville) are \$98 per credit hour. The cost per credit hour for other Missouri residents is \$131. Online courses require an additional fee.

SFCC participates in the Missouri A+ program. It allows students who complete the requirements of the program at their A+ certified high schools to earn paid tution at a public community college.

The SFCC Financial Aid office can help you plan for the cost of getting an education. Forms of aid include scholarships, grants and loans. A payment plan also is available. Nurse Aide Skills Certificate

Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)

CNAs perform basic nursing skills to care for clients in longterm care facilities, hospitals and/ or through home health agencies. The program includes on-ground and online classroom and onsite clinical experiences that are designed to complement each other. Upon successful completion of both components, students will be eligible to take the final exam to become CNAs through the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. Additional state-mandated requirements may be required to be employed as a CNA in a long-term care facility.

Certified Nurse Assistant ^

HEOC 152 6 Corequisite: HEOC 155. Certified Nurse Assistant training prepares individuals for employment in a long-term care facility, teaching skills in resident care under the direct supervision of a licensed nurse. CNA and CNA Clinical will meet state requirements for CNA training. Additional state mandated requirements may be required to be employed as a CNA in a longterm care facility. Note: If a student passes HEOC 152, but does not pass HEOC 155, the student will have one additional semester to retake HEOC 155 from a regularly scheduled State Fair Community College course. Any retake of HEOC 155 after one semester will require that HEOC 152 be retaken.

Certified Nurse Assistant ^ Clinical HEOC 155 2

Corequisite: HEOC 152. Training provides 100 hours of on-the-job training with state-approved clinical supervisors in a long-term care facility. At the conclusion of the clinical sessions, a two-part, state-approved final examination must be passed. The two-part final examination includes a written or oral assessment and a practicum examination. This is a pass/fail course.

Certified Medication Technician (CMT)

Prospective CMT students must have been CNAs for at least six months and provide a copy of the CNA certificate or CNA identification card (front and back); have a recommendation letter from a Director of Nursing or Facility Administrator; and complete the TABE test and achieve an appropriate score. Upon successful completion of both components, students will be eligible to take the final exam to become Certified Medication Technicians through the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

Certified Medication Technician ^ 4

Prerequisite: Active Listing on the Missouri CNA Registry. This Certified Medication Technician training program prepares individuals for employment in a long-term care facility. Skills are taught in administration of nonparenteral medications to assist LPNs or RNs in medication therapy. Training consists of at least 60 hours of classroom instruction. Upon successful completion of both this course and HEOC 160, the student will be eligible to take the final exam to become a Certified Medication Technician through the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

CMT Clinical ^ HEOC 1601

Corequisite: HEOC 158. Training includes at least 15 hours of clinical practice under direct supervision. The student will participate in administering nonparenteral medications in a long-term care facility. This is a pass/fail course.

Restorative Nurse Assistant (RNA)

The Restorative Nurse Assistant is an expanded role for the Certified Nurse Assistant. The RNA acquires special knowledge and techniques in therapeutic rehabilitation as prescribed and supervised by licensed personnel. Prospective RNA students must have been CNAs for at least six months and provide a copy of the CNA certificate or CNA identification card (front and back); have a recommendation letter from a Director of Nursing or Facility Administrator; and provide a copy of high school diploma or GED certificate.

Restorative Nurse Assistant

The Restorative Nurse Assistant training program is designed to train aides to fulfill requirements for efficient rehabilitative care of residents in nursing homes. The student will have the opportunity to learn the rehabilitative philosophy, work with departmental organizations and understand the role of the physical therapist and the proper techniques of body mechanics, transfers and ambulation.

Insulin Administration HEOC 172......5

This class prepares medication technicians in a skilled or intermediate care facility or medication aides in a residential care facility (RCF) or assisted living facility (ALF) to administer insulin.

The program is designed to present information on diabetes as it relates to symptoms and implications of proper or improper treatment and to teach skills in insulin administration in order to qualify students to perform this procedure in long-term care facilities in Missouri.

The curriculum includes procedures and instruction on diabetes and its treatment and complications; types of insulins; techniques of insulin administration; and methods of monitoring blood sugar levels.

Level I Medication Aide (LIMA) HEOC 170.....

The Level I Medication Aide (LIMA) class teaches skills in medication administration of nonparenteral (oral or by inhalation) medications and prepares individuals for employment as a LIMA in residential care facilities (RCFs) and assisted living facilities (ALFs) in Missouri.

The curriculum is a minimum of 16 hours which includes procedures and instructions in basic human needs and relationships; drug classifications and their implications; assessing drug reactions; techniques of drug administration; medication storage and control; drug reference resources; and infection control.

Phlebotomy ^ HEOC 146...... 6

This online course is designed to provide the students with the knowledge, skills, and techniques necessary to perform as a phlebotomist in the clinical setting. The student will learn various procedures and laboratory techniques in handling human blood. The student must satisfactorily perform in a laboratory setting as well as pass written tests.

Upon successful completion of the course, students are eligible to take certification exams, which are required by some employers and may make you more marketable in a job search.
