Advanced Manufacturing Training Starts This Fall !

Local manufacturers have highlighted the strong need for new and experienced workers in advanced manufacturing.

Due to the aging workforce and high demand, there are more precision manufacturing jobs than qualified workers to fill them.

Experienced precision machinists can make \$40,000 to \$75,000 annually

Greenfield Community College has partnered with Franklin County Technical School, the Franklin Hampshire Regional Employment Board and Career Centers, and a consortium of area manufacturing companies to develop and implement new training programs to meet this growing need.



A 12-week intensive training program to prepare unemployed/ underemployed adults for entry-level CNC machining will be held weekday evenings at FCTS starting in September.

The curriculum will include blueprint reading, math for manufacturing, metrology, MASTERCAM, and CAD/CAM instruction, with a significant portion of the 220 hr. training dedicated to hands-on applications in a shop.
