Nursing Assistant @ QCC

The Nursing Assistant program prepares a student for a career as a nursing assistant. Certified nursing assistants are important members of the healthcare team as they provide basic care to patients in long term care facilities, acute care, homecare, and residential facilities.

Upon completion of the program, graduates will be able to:

- Understand medical terminology, nutrition, communication skills, basic anatomy, basic motion, infection control, and safety.
- Perform basic patient care, patient care procedures, transferring patients, vital signs, and range of motion exercises.
- Gain knowledge to provide care to those who choose to live in their own homes, long term care facilities, acute care, or in residential facilities.

Did You Know...?

- Employment of nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants is expected to grow by 20 percent from 2010 to 2020, faster than the average for all occupations. Because of the growing elderly population, many nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants will be needed in long-term care facilities, such as nursing homes.
- QCC's program provides a great opportunity for students to gain entry-level employment in healthcare, while providing additional foundational skills for today's healthcare field.
- If students complete QCC's Nurse Assistant Certificate, maintain a GPA of 3.0 and meet the admission requirements of a Healthcare program, they will be guaranteed admission on a space available basis.
