Campus Corner: Middlesex Community College's Health & STEM Career Pathways Center



Since its grand opening in March 2013, Middlesex Community College's Health & STEM Pathways Center has focused on generating academic achievement and successful career outcomes. Funded by the Transformation Agenda, the Pathways Center is located at MCC's Lowell campus, open daily to students for appointments and walk-ins.

The Pathways Center's support services include: tutoring, supplemental instruction, academic and career advising, study groups, peer mentoring, group coaching, test simulation software, career-related field trips, industry-specific workshops, networking events and job search skills. This coming summer, the Pathways Center will also house and manage "STEM Starter Academy" and "Summer Bridge" programs. These programs are designed to increase student awareness, access and readiness for STEM programs of study and careers.

According to student Bhavika Sachin Patel, the Bridge Program "confirmed what program I should be in. I only intended to study for one year and then go get a job, but the support that I got from the people at the center has made me want to study further and get my associate's [degree]."

Biotech and Life Sciences Team Hosts Two Successful Industry Forums



Two Industry Forums this February brought together representatives from Massachusetts life science companies, community colleges and staffing agencies to review data regarding entry level employment opportunities in local life science companies. These collegial conversations also helped build and enhance relationships between these different groups, strengthen awareness of the community college programs and address any gaps between student preparedness and job requirements, and covered steps community colleges and industry can take moving forward. New Contextualized Modules Released

Twelve new contextualized, digital curriculum modules have been added to those already produced as part of the Transformation Agenda. These modules, focused on health care and advanced manufacturing were written by EDC staff based on the generous input from campus faculty, industry representatives and other stakeholders who attended curriculum development workshops last fall. Six of the modules are aligned to key Common Core State Standards in math, with the remaining six aligned to CCSS in Literacy. Each module includes relevant standards, an industry overview, a workplace scenario, instructional context and tips for faculty, and contextualized learning activities, test items and projects. Many of the modules also feature extension activities, multimedia and additional related resources.

The twelve new modules have been added to the MCCWDTA Contextualized Curriculum website (http://mccwdta.etlo.org/) with the 24 modules that were produced earlier in the grant. They are available as open education resources for use in community college and adult basic education classrooms across the state.

MA Community College Teachers Benefit from EdTech Leaders Online Blended Learning Course Twelve educators from several community colleges in Massachusetts recently completed an eightweek online course facilitated for the Transformation Agenda by EdTech Leaders Online to learn how to improve instruction and student engagement by implementing blended learning into their teaching. The participants completed online readings, participated in web-based and multimedia activities, and facilitated online discussions to learn effective strategies for teaching blended courses.

Several participants who completed the course said that it exceeded their expectations and described how they valued the collaboration among peers as well as the exposure to many new web-based tools and resources. Many wished for more time to be able to learn and share with their online colleagues. As one participant said,

"It was a great resource and wealth of knowledge and I am very grateful to have participated. I shared my experience with several of my colleagues and networks. This course helped me to resolve a staff and student connectivity problem. I now can reach, teach, share and update my students enrolled in my online class. It's great."
