Connecticut Health & Life Sciences Career Initiative (HL-SCI)

Overview:

In Connecticut, the Health and Life Sciences represent an area of significant strategic growth. Currently, approximately 200,000 people in the state work in health and life science, with at least another 11,000 additional jobs expected in the next eight years.

The Health and Life Sciences Career Initiative is designed to prepare workers to take on these new jobs with a particular focus in recruitment on veterans, TAA-eligible workers (those displaced by foreign trade), dislocated, unemployed and underemployed workers.

- Gateway Community College (GCC)
