Attendance Grading criteria	Attendance is 10 percent of the final grade. I follow a curved scale for attendance as follows: 0 to 2 classes = 10% Or Full Attendance credit. This is very easy to receive full credit. 3 classes = 5% or ½ Credit 4 or more classes = -10% Deduction from total Grade. Note: This is not 0% of 10%. This is a 10% deduction of your final grade. Two late attendances or tardies will count as one missed class period. If your schedule is such that full attendance is not possible (work schedule, etc), do not take this class. Summer classes are very short in length. There is no time for makeups. With the shortened semester (10 weeks) a lot is covered in a small amount of time. It is very easy to "fall of the edge" and not be able to get back on track. STAY AHEAD. Your grade for the course is based on tests, homework exercises, class exercises, quizzes and a comprehensive final. Each of these are weighted to the final score as follows: Attendance = 10% Tests = 50% Final = 20%
	Class exercises (labs, quizzes &HW) = 20% Failure to complete any class exercise (lab) will result in a 4% deduction in a student's grade. Substitute labs must be arranged with instructor within one week. This is your responsibility and NOT THE INSTRUCTOR! Attendance will be recorded each class period. Students who conduct themselves in an unprofessional manner (plagiarism, harassment) may be given a failing or reduced grade. Failure to complete any class exercise (lab) will result in a 4% deduction in a student's grade. Failure to complete a homework exercise will result in a 2% deduction in a students grade.
