Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

The MCC Occupational Therapy Assistant program is designed for students with an interest in working with individuals who are limited in what they can do because of a physical, emotional or developmental disability, illness or the aging process. The goal of occupational therapy is to help people of any age live their lives to the fullest—at home, at work or at school—by making it possible for them to perform life's everyday activities.

The Occupational Therapy Assistant program at MCC combines course work with a four-month supervised clinical experience that focuses on the psycho-social, physical and developmental aspects of practicing occupational therapy. The program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education and graduates of the program are eligible to take the national certification examination to become a Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant.

OTA Job Description


Depending on your employer or the setting in which you work, your occupational therapy career, under the supervision of a registered occupational therapist, may include:

- Aiding in the growth and development of infants and toddlers
- Enhancing learning environments for physically or mentally challenged schoolchildren
- Adapting home environments for people dealing with the effects of a physical disability or dementia
- Analyzing task requirements for an injured worker
- Teaching skills for independent function to clients who have lost the ability to take care of themselves due to illness or injury
- Leading group sessions to teach coping and interpersonal skills to individuals with mental illness

The Occupational Therapy Assistant program is a two-year associate degree program. The program can be completed on an accelerated, full-time or part-time basis according to the needs of the individual student. Courses within the program include a variety of general education courses as well as occupational therapy courses that prepare the student for work in this challenging and exciting field.
