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NORTHERN Student Lesson: Making YouTube Video using Creative Commons

Don't panic!

Expect: Oops; Rats!; What the heck?! and other stuff to happen.

Play, learn and create.

Such is life!

1. \	What is the purpose of your video? (To teach, to entertain, to explain, demonstrate?)
2. \	Who is your audience? (Who are you intending to share this with? Why them?)
3. I	How long does it need to be? (Shorter is better.)
4. \	What idea(s) are you trying to communicate through images/video?
	What images/ideas come to mind when you think of this topic? (Brainstorm at least 10, but no more an 20)






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STEPS to make the video

- 1. Create a name-based Gmail account (or log in if you already have one).
- 2. Log into YouTube using that Gmail.
- 3. Go to the video editor (Create).



- 4. Find the Creative Commons image circle. Search for your topic.
- 5. Drag images into the video editor in the order you'd like them to appear.
- 6. Use the CC search to find music by going to the musical NOTE and drag music to the note symbol.
- 7. When video is complete, save "My Edited Video" using a name you will remember.
- 8. In Video Manager you may edit the description for the video and mark it as public or private.
