## **Digital Literacy I: Fundamentals** Unit 3 Software Installation LAB 1 Installing and Uninstalling Software (Instructor)

#### Explanation

In this lab, students will demonstrate how to safely download and install applications from the Internet, and uninstall programs using the Control Panel. The procedure assumes that the browser's default save-to location is the Download folder; if not, then assist the student in locating the file once it's downloaded.

#### Prompts

- 1. Did you note the folder where the installation file was downloaded to?
- 2. What would you do if malware was discovered in the installation file?
- 3. Besides running a virus scan, how else could you find out if the software is malicious?
- 4. Why is it important to create a system restore point before installing the application?
  - a. In case the application causes system issues, it can be removed and the system repaired by rewinding the computer to a point in time before the application was installed.
- 5. How did you determine a name for the system restore point?
- 6. Are you carefully examining the installation steps and buttons or are you just clicking "Next"?
- 7. Do you notice any prompts or checkboxes to install additional software or third-party programs such as custom search bars?
