Delaware Technical Community College is excited to offer qualifying students, veterans, and veterans' spouses an opportunity to obtain an Associate Degree in Nursing in a newly designed curriculum and format at the Stanton, Owens (Georgetown) or Terry (Dover) Campus.

Beginning Spring 2014 the new Nursing Associate Degree program will offer:

- Accelerated and a non-accelerated option
- Day and evening classes (offerings vary by campus)
- Fewer required credits to graduate
- Student-centered teaching
- 24/7 learning opportunities

Multiple entry and exit points give students options:

- Students who complete the Nurse Assistant Training class qualify to become a Certified Nursing Assistant
- Currently Licensed Practical Nurses and Paramedics receive advance standing
- Students in good standing can choose to exit in as little as one semester and transition into the License Practical Nurse credential
