This document is a written articulation agreement for the core Diversified Manufacturing Technology (DMT) certificate between the five Nebraska community colleges which comprise the Project IMPACT Consortium. This *Consortium DMT Articulation* deliverable was developed for the Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT) Grant Program Round 2 Grant, Innovations Moving People to Achieve Certified Training (IMPACT): TC-23752-12-60-A-31.

Innovations Moving People to Achieve Certified Training (IMPACT)

1) Consortium Member Institutions

Five Nebraska community colleges (Central Community College (Grantee Institution), Metropolitan Community College, Northeast Community College, Southeast Community College and Western Nebraska Community College) agree to participate in a consortium to implement the grant proposal *Innovations Moving People to Achieve Certified Training* (IMPACT), a response to the U.S. Department of Labor's 2012 Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT) grants program (SGA/DFA PY 11-08).

2) Articulation Responsibilities of Consortium Members

As defined in the Project IMPACT grant proposal, Consortium members will:

- Articulate 25% of skilled and technical science course offerings across the Consortium member institutions.
- Establish pathways from certificate to diploma and AAS degree awards in areas including advanced manufacturing, mechatronics, quality, drafting, welding, instrumentation, and energy operations across the Consortium.
- Align course offerings and related pathways with the National Association of Manufacturers (NAM) Skills Certification system and other nationally-recognized industry credentials.

3) Articulation Resolution

Consortium members jointly establish a core Diversified Manufacturing Technology (DMT) certificate which aligns with four NAM-endorsed, Manufacturing Skill Standards Council (MSSC) Certified Production Technician (CPT) modules. The DMT course alignment to the MSSC CPT credential provides industry-endorsed training and education in safety, quality, production, and maintenance. The *Diversified Manufacturing Technology Articulation Matrix* (Table 1) describes the specific Consortium course articulations.
