

# TAACCCT Facilities Maintenance and Operations Training Program

Thank you for your interest in the Facilities Maintenance and Operations Technician Training Program at the College of Southern Nevada (CSN). Facilities Maintenance and Operations are conducted at the entry level by facilities technicians who are responsible for the appearance and working order of hotel and convention guest rooms, hospital and medical rooms, and government facilities. These hands-on problem solvers diagnose, assess and repair electrical, plumbing, heating, and air conditioning. Facilities technicians must be able to read and interpret technical information and maintain records of customer interactions and the resulting work. In addition to operating hand and power tools, they must have computer skills and knowledge of codes, laws, and regulations regarding safety, fire, and ADA regulations.

As schools, hospitals, hotels and other buildings are always in need of maintenance; job growth in this area is expected to increase over the next decade. Students completing this program receive the training and skills needed in this growing field and will have a competitive edge when seeking employment.

## This four-month course features:

- National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) core curriculum including electrical, plumbing and HVAC modules
- Work readiness training (resume building, interview skills, career planning)
- Hands-on learning in a lab environment
- Basic skills integrated with a classroom setting offering comprehensive support
- Available tutoring to assist students with GED preparation, academic and work skills, and continuing education program information

Basic skills are integrated into the classroom teaching format, giving students support in comprehension of content. Tutors are available in the Studio Lab to assist in GED preparation, improving academic, and work skills to enter the job market or continuing educational programs.



Upon completion of the required curriculum, students will receive both NCCER certification and a CSN Certificate of Completion.
